BODHAM INCLOSURE.

EXTRACTS

Award of the Commissioners named and appointed in and by an AEt of Parliament, passed in the forty-eighth Year of the Reign of his prefent Majesty, King George the Third, entitled, " An AEt for inclosing Lands in the Parish of Bod-" ham, in the County of Norfolk."

N the first place, WE do hereby set out and appoint the several Public Carriage-Roads, and the Public Road or Footway hereinafter described; that is to say, FIRST, ONE PUBLIC CARRIAGE-ROAD, beginning at or near the south-east corner of the allotment hereby made to William Emery, and proceeding from thence, nearly in a west direction, and on the north side of the fifth allotment hereby made to John Thruston Mott, Esquire, to the north-east corner of the second allotment hereby made to Jonathan Wrench and Elizabeth his Wife; and from thence, nearly in the same direction and in its present course, to the north-east corner of the fixth allotment hereby made to the said John Thruston Mott; and from thence, nearly in the same direction and on the north side of the allotment last-mentioned, to the north-west corner thereof, where it enters the parish of Kelling in the said County of Norfolk-which road is called Holt Road. SECOND, ONE OTHER PUBLIC CARRIAGE-ROAD, beginning at the east end of the public carriage-road first-described, and proceeding from thence, nearly in 2nd Cronces flow north-east and east directions and in its present course, to the south corner of the first allotment hereby made to Richard Pile; and from thence, nearly in a north-east direction and on the south-east side of the allotment last-mentioned, to the north-east corner thereof, where it enters the parish of West Beckham in the faid County of Norfolk—which public carriage-road lastly described is called Cromer Road. THIRD, ONE OTHER PUBLIC CAR-

RIAGE-ROAD, beginning at the east end of the public carriage-road firstdescribed, and proceeding from thence, nearly in a west direction and in its present course, to the south-west corner of the fourth allotment hereby made to the faid Jonathan Wrench and Elizabeth his Wife; and from thence, nearly in a north direction and on the west side of the allotment last-mentioned, to the north-west corner thereof, where it enters the parish of Waborne in the faid County of Norfolk-which public carriage-road laftly defcribed is called Waborne Road. FOURTH, ONE OTHER PUBLIC CAR-RIAGE-ROAD, branching out of the public carriage-road lastly described at rofs Road the north-west corner of the third allotment hereby made to the said Jonathan Wrench and Elizabeth his Wife, and proceeding from thence, nearly in a fouth direction and on the west side of the allotment last-mentioned, to the fouth-west corner thereof, where it enters the public carriage-road first-defcribed—which public carriage-road lastly described is called Cross Road. FIFTH, ONE OTHER PUBLIC CARRIAGE-ROAD, beginning at the east end of the public carriage-road first-described, and proceeding from thence, nearly in east and south-east directions and in its present course, to the north fide of a meffuage or dwelling-house standing upon the allotment hereby made to Dennis Gunton, Esquire, where it enters the said parish of West Beckham-which public carriage-road laftly described is called Beckham SIXTH, ONE OTHER PUBLIC CARRIAGE-ROAD, branching out of the public carriage-road laftly described at the north-west corner of the first allotment hereby made to John Emery, and proceeding from thence, nearly in a fouth direction and in its present course, to the north-west corner of the allotment hereby made to the Reverend Theophilus Girdlestone, Clerk, as Rector of the rectory of Bodham in the faid County of Norfolk; and from thence, nearly in an east direction and in its present course, to the north-east corner of the first allotment hereby made to Anthony Hamond, Esquire, Sir Jacob Henry Aftley, Baronet, and Dame Hester his Wife; and from thence, nearly in a fouth direction and on the east fide of the allotment last-menstioned, to the fouth-east corner thereof; and from thence, nearly in a southwest direction and in its present course, to the south-west corner of the same allotment, where it enters the parish of Baconsthorpe in the said County of Norfolk-which public carriage-road lastly described is called Baconsthorpe Road. SEVENTH, ONE OTHER PUBLIC CARRIAGE ROAD, branching out of the public carriage-road lastly described at the north-east corner of the first allotment hereby made to the faid Anthony Hamond, Sir Jacob Henry Astley and Dame Hester his Wife, and proceeding from thence, nearly in an east direction and in its present course, to the south-east corner of the allotment hereby made to Robert Golty and Elizabeth his Wife, where it enters the faid parish of West Beckham-which public carriage-road lastly described is called Gresham Road. EIGHTH, ONE OTHER PUBLIC CAR-RIAGE-ROAD, branching out of the public carriage-road fixthly described at the faid north-west corner of the allotment hereby made to the said Rector of the faid rectory of Bodham, and proceeding from thence, nearly in west and north-west directions and in its present course, to the south-east corner of the first allotment hereby made to the Trustees for the Poor of the said parish of Bodham; and from thence, nearly in a west direction and on the fouth fide of the same allotment, to the fouth-west corner thereof, where it enters the parish of Holt in the said county of Norfolk—which public carriage-road lastly described is called Kelling Road. NINTH, ONE OTHER

PUBLIC CARRIAGE-ROAD, branching out of the public carriage-road lastly described at the north-west corner of the first allotment hereby made to Richard Gurney, Efquire, and proceeding from thence, nearly in a fouth direction and on the west side of the same allotment, to the south-west corner thereof, where it enters the parish of Hempstead in the said county of Norfolk -which public carriage-road lastly described is called Hempstead Road.
TENTH, ONE OTHER PUBLIC CARRIAGE-ROAD, branching out of 10th Church the faid public carriage-road first-described, at the north-west corner of the faid fecond allotment hereby made to the faid Jonathan Wrench and Elizabeth his Wife, and proceeding from thence, in fouth and fouth-east directions and in its present course, to the south-west corner of the said fifth allotment hereby made to the said John Thruston Mott, where it enters the said public carriage-road eighthly described-which public carriage-road lastly described is called Church Road. ELEVENTH, ONE OTHER PUBLIC CAR-RIAGE-ROAD, branching out of the public carriage-road lastly described, at the fouth-east corner of the second allotment hereby made to John Fisher, Esquire, and Martha his Wife, and proceeding from thence, nearly in west and fouth-west directions and in its present course, to the north-west corner of the fecond allotment hereby made to Richard Fish, where it enters the faid public carriage-road eighthly described—which public carriage-road lastly described is called Low Common Road. TWELFTH, ONE OTHER 19 PUBLIC CARRIAGE-ROAD, beginning at the north-east corner of the allotment hereby made to frederica Maxina becilialindham Widow and proceeding from thence, nearly in a north-west direction, along the east fide of the second allotment hereby made to the said Anthony Hamond, Sir Jacob Henry Assley and Dame Hester his Wife, to a point at the distance of about two hundred and twenty yards from the faid north-east corner of the faid allotment hereby made to the faid fraderica martina becilia windhau where it enters the faid parish of West Beckham—which public carriage-road lastly described is called Barningham Road. THIRTEENTH, AND ONE OTHER PUBLIC ROAD (being a footway only), beginning at the north-cast corner of the tenth allotment hereby made to the said John Thruston Mott, and proceeding from thence, nearly in a fouth direction and on the east fide of the same allotment, to the south-east corner thereof, where it enters the faid parish of Baconsthorpe-which said public road or footway is called Baconsthorpe Tootway.

AND WE do hereby fet out and appoint the five Private Roads hereinafter described; that is to say, FIRST, ONE PRIVATE ROAD, branching out of the faid public carriage-road secondly described, at the south-west corner of the second allotment hereby made to the said Richard Pile, and proceeding from thence, nearly in an east direction and on the fouth fide of the same allotment, to the fouth-east corner thereof; which private road is hereby set out and appointed for the use and convenience of the owner or owners, and occupier or occupiers, for the time being, of the land adjoining to the fame. SECOND, ONE OTHER PRIVATE ROAD, branching out of the faid public carriage-road fifthly described, at the fouth-west corner of the second allotment hereby made to John Clark, and proceeding from thence, nearly in a north direction and on the west fide of the same allotment, to the northwest corner thereof, where it enters the faid public carriage-road secondly described; which private road lastly described is hereby set out and appointed

for the use and convenience of the owner or owners, and occupier or occupiers, for the time being, of the land adjoining to the fame, and of the land hereby allotted to Cook Flower, Esquire, and Sarah Ditchell his Wife, and the said John Emery. THIRD, ONE OTHER PRIVATE ROAD, branching out of faid public carriage-road fixthly described, at the fouth-west corner of the third allotment hereby made to the faid Anthony Hamond, Sir Jacob Henry Aftley, and Dame Hester his Wife, and proceeding from thence, nearly in a north direction, to the fouth-west corner of the fourth allotment hereby made to the said Anthony Hamond, Sir Jacob Henry Astley, and Dame Hester his Wife; which private road lastly described is set out and appointed for the use and convenience of the owner or owners, and occupier or occupiers, for the time being, of the land adjoining to the fame. FOURTH, ONE OTHER PRIVATE ROAD, branching out of the faid public carriage-road eighthly described, at the north-east corner of the eleventh allotment hereby made to the faid John Thruston Mott, and proceeding from thence, nearly in a fouth direction, to the north-west corner of the fixth allotment hereby made to the Surveyors of the Highways in Bodham aforefaid; which private road laftly described is hereby set out and appointed for the use and convenience of all and every person and persons who, by virtue of this our Award, shall or may be interested in the fixth allotment hereby made to the faid Surveyors of the Highways. FIFTH, AND ONE OTHER PRIVATE ROAD, branching out of the said public carriage-road fixthly described, at the north-west corner of the allotment hereby made to the Right Honourable William Asheton Lord Suffield and Caroline Hans, Lady Suffield, his Wife, in her right, and proceeding from thence, nearly in fouth and east directions and on the west and south sides of the same allotment, to the north-west corner of the allotment hereby made to John Spurrell, which private road laftly described is hereby set out and appointed for the use and convenience of the owner or owners, and occupier or occupiers, for the time being, of the land adjoining to the same. AND WE do hereby declare, that the faid Private Roads are hereby fet out and appointed for the use and convenience of the faid Theophilus Girdlestone, as Rector of the faid rectory of Bodham, and of his Successors, Rectors of the said rectory, for the time being for ever, and for the use and convenience of the Lords of the several Manors mentioned in this our Award, to pass to and from the lands and tenements which, in pursuance of this our Award, shappe holden of the said Manors respectively by Copy of Court-Roll, and to or towards which the faid private roads respectively lead. AND WE do hereby order and direct, that the said several Private Roads hereby set out and appointed shall be and remain of the breadth of eighteen feet, and shall for ever hereafter be supported and kept in repair by and at the expence of the owners and proprietors of lands in the faid parish of Bodham, in such shares and proportions as the public highways within the same parish are by law to be supported and kept in repair: and that they shall place, or cause to be placed, proper gates, stiles, bridges, and planks, where the same shall be necessary for the accommodation of passengers, cattle, and carriages, passing and repassing thereon; and shall for ever maintain and keep the same stiles, bridges, and planks, in good repair and condition.

Allotments to the Surveyors of the High-Highways within the faid parish of Bodham, the fix pieces of land next hereinways. after described; that is to fay, FIRST, ONE PIECE OF LAND, containing by measure two roods, bounded by land hereby allotted to Benjamin Emery and Ann his wife towards the north and east, by the faid public carriage-road fecondly described towards the south, and by land hereby allotted to the faid John Emery towards the west. SECOND, ONE OTHER PIECE OF LAND, containing by measure thirty-two perches, bounded by the faid public carriage-road first-described towards the north, by land hereby allotted to the faid John Thruston Mott towards the east, by the next allotment towards the fouth, and by the boundary-line of the faid parishes of Holt and Kelling towards the west. THIRD, ONE OTHER PIECE OF LAND, containing by measure one rood and eight perches, bounded by the last allotment in part and by land hereby allotted to the said John Thruston Mott in part towards the north, by the allotment last-mentioned towards the east, by land hereby allotted to the said Trustees for the Poor of the said parish of Bodham towards the fouth, and by the boundary-line of the faid parish of Holt towards the west. FOURTH, ONE OTHER PIECE OF LAND, containing by measure two roods, bounded by land hereby allotted to the faid John Thruston Mott towards the north and west, by land hereby allotted to John Pigott towards the east, and by the said public carriage-road eighthly described towards the fouth. FIFTH, ONE OTHER PIECE OF LAND, containing by measure three roods, bounded by land hereby allotted to the faid John Thruston Mott towards the north and east, by the allotment last-mentioned in part and by the said public carriage-road tenthly described in part towards the fouth, and by land hereby allotted to the faid Jonathan Wrench and Elizabeth his Wife towards the west. SIXTH, AND ONE OTHER PIECE OF LAND, containing by measure three roods, bounded by the faid private road fourthly described in part, and by land hereby allotted to the faid Rector of the faid rectory of Bodham in part, towards the north, and by land hereby allotted to the faid John Thruston Mott towards the east, south, and west. AND WE do hereby certify and declare, that We have made, or given directions for making, the fences hereinafter mentioned in the faid allotments to the faid Surveyors of the Highways; that is to fay, in the faid first allotment on the north and east sides thereof; in the faid second allotment on the west side thereof; in the said third allotment on the fouth and west sides thereof; in the said fourth allotment on the north, fouth, and west sides thereof; in the said fifth allotment on the north, south, and east fides thereof; and in the faid fixth allotment on the east and fouth fides thereof; and that We have placed, or given directions for placing, gate-posts and gates in the same allotments. AND WE do hereby order and direct, that the Surveyors of the Highways in Bodham aforesaid, for the time being, shall for ever maintain in good repair the fences, gate-posts, and gates so made and placed, or directed to be made and placed, as aforesaid; and also such parts of the old boundary-fences upon the faid first, fifth, and fixth allotments to them, as have been heretofore kept in repair by the former owner or owners thereof.

AND WE do hereby certify and declare, that the last allotment to the said Directions respecting Surveyors of the Highways is made as and for a public marl and clay pit, and that the other five allotments to them are made as and for public fand and gravel pits, and to the intent that the same allotments shall for ever

the Use of Allotments to the Surveyors of the Highhereafter be used by the Surveyors of the Highways, and by the proprietors of lands and estates within the said parish of Bodham, and their tenants for the time being, according to the true intent and meaning of the said Act passed in the forty-eighth year of his said Majesty's reign.

Allotments to the Trustees for the Poor.

AND WE do hereby affign, fet out, and allot unto the faid John Thruston Mott, Lord of the faid Manor of Bodham, the faid Theophilus Girdlestone, Rector of the faid rectory of Bodham, and the Churchwardens and Overfeers of the Poor of the said parish of Bodham, as Trustees for the Poor of the same parish, the two pieces of land, being part of the said commons and waste lands, next hereinaster described; that is to say, FIRST, ONE PIECE OF LAND, containing by measure fourteen acres, three roods, and seven perches, bounded by land hereby allotted to the faid Surveyors of the Highways in part, and by land hereby allotted to the faid John Thruston Mott in part, towards the north, by land hereby allotted to the faid John Thruston Mott towards the east, by the faid public carriage-road eighthly described towards the fouth, and by the boundary-line of the faid parish of Holt towards the west. SECOND, AND ONE OTHER PIECE OF LAND, containing by measure three acres, one rood, and twenty-seven perches, bounded by the said public carriage-road eighthly described towards the north, by the said public carriage-road ninthly described towards the east, by land hereby allotted to Henry Dampier, Esquire, and Jeremiah Smith, Gentleman, towards the fouth, and by the boundary-line of the faid parish of Holt towards the west. And We do hereby certify and declare, that we have made, or given directions for making, the fences hereinafter mentioned in the two last allotments; that is to fay, in the first allotment, on the east and fouth sides thereof; and in the last allotment, on the north, south, and east sides thereof: and that We have placed, or given directions for placing, gate-posts and gates in the same allot-ments. And We do hereby order and direct, that such sences, gate-posts, and gates shall be for ever maintained in good repair by the Trustees for the Poor of the faid parish of Bodham for the time being. And We do hereby certify and declare, that the land comprised in the two last allotments is, in our judgement, equal in value to the average value of fifteen acres of the faid commons and waste lands.

Directions respect-

AND WE do hereby order and direct, that the several new sences hereby directed to be made, shall consist of ditches four seet wide at the top and three seet deep perpendicular, and of banks adjoining such ditches, and formed of the earth taken from the same; and that the banks of such sences shall be planted with white thorn layer in a proper manner, and that half-hurdles, thorns, or other sufficient sences shall be set on the summit of such banks, and shall remain, or if taken away or spoiled shall from time to time be renewed, during the space of seven years next ensuing the date of this our Award: and that such sences shall be made on the land of the several proprietors who are hereby directed to make the same. And We do also order and direct, that at all times hereaster the water which shall be in any ditch or ditches of the said respective allotments shall be permitted to pass freely into and through the ditches of the allotments adjoining to the same; and that the ditches of such sences as are hereby directed to be made against any of the public or private roads hereby set out and appointed, shall be made

against the lands to be thereby inclosed, and not against the said public or private roads. And We do order, that when and so often as any of the old boundary-sences shall be cut and scoured, such sences and the disches thereof shall be made of the width, breadth, and depth aforesaid, and that white thorn layer shall be planted in such sences if requisite.

AND WE do hereby direct, that this our Award, with the Map or Plan Award where to be thereto annexed, shall be deposited and kept in the parish-church of Bod-deposited. ham aforesaid, in a tin box to be provided for that purpose.
